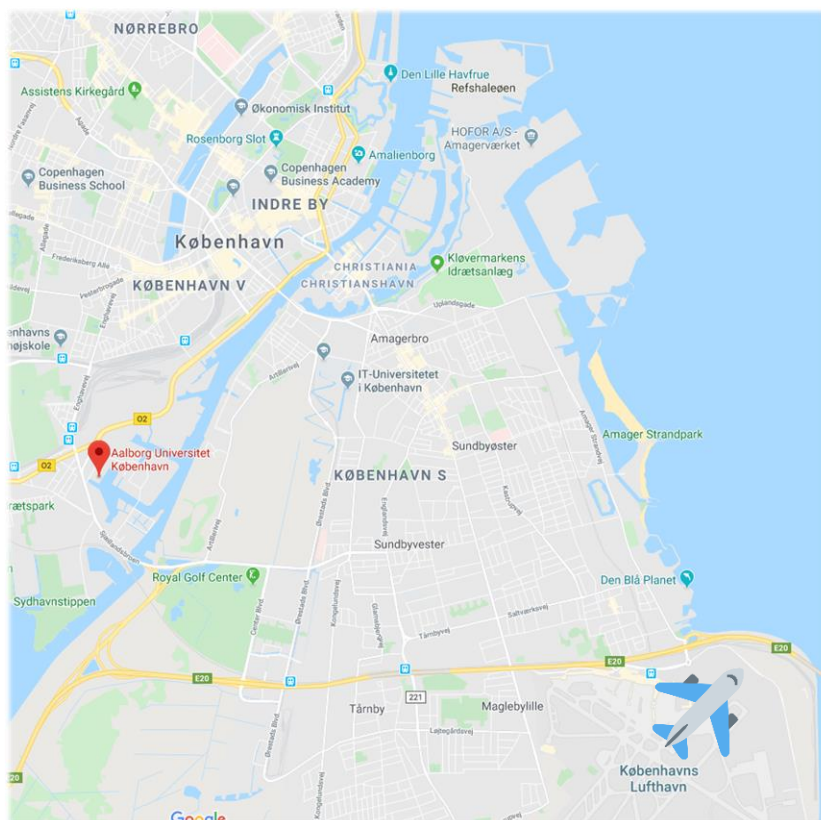

Campus

Travel information going to AAU Copenhagen

How to get from the airport, Copenhagen Airport (CPH), to Sydhavn:

Public transportation - You have the following options:

Option 1: Take the *metro to Nørreport (M2 direction Vanløse)*

and

change to the *S-train to Sydhavn* (Line A or E, both direction Køge). It takes around 30 minutes.

Option 2: Take a *regional/intercity train to København H* at platform 2

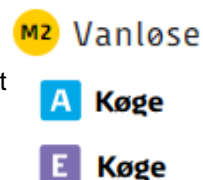
and

change to the *S-train to Sydhavn* (Line A or E, both direction Køge). It takes around 25 minutes.

Metro: Runs every 4-6 minutes during the day and every 15-20 minutes at night.

S-train: Runs every 10 minutes during the day and do not run at night, besides from Friday and Saturday where it runs every half an hour.

Regional/intercity trains: Run several times per hour during the day and they still run at night, just with less frequency. Please check the screens at the station or the website below for the exact train.

Both the metro station and platform 2 are accessible through Terminal 3, which is where you exit the luggage claim. You can buy a ticket in the ticket machines in Terminal 3. If you wish to travel more in Copenhagen or other places in Denmark by public transport, then it is recommendable to buy a '[rejsekort](#)', which is a travel card that you refill.

If you are only using public transportation to and from the airport, then you can purchase a one-way ticket.

Taxi

The taxi pick up point is located directly outside Terminal 3. A fixed taximeter calculates the fare – ask the driver if you want an estimate of the price. The ride is around 10-15 minutes.



Driving (car rental)

If you wish to drive yourself, it is possible to rent a car at the airport. You can find further information on the rental firms here: <https://info.parkering.cph.dk/en/car-rental>. If you wish to park at the parking lot of the university, you can get a parking license by asking in the campus reception when you get here. Another possibility is renting a City Car through the apps DriveNow or GreenMobility. You only pay for the minutes you use the car and they can be parked anywhere in Copenhagen. The city cars are in the parking area P7 outside Terminal 3.

Currency

The local currency is Danske Kroner (DKK). Most Danes pay by card which is possible almost everywhere. However, if you wish to use cash, you can withdraw money in the ATMs available in many places. The exchange rate follows the euro and as of January 2020, the rate is the following:

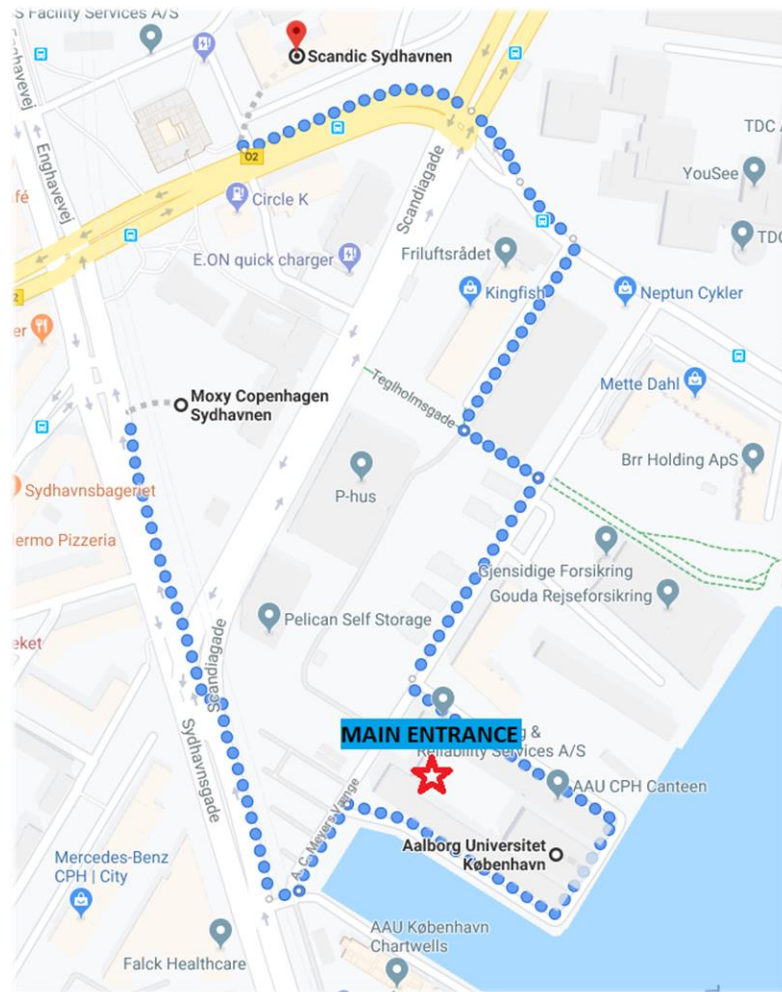
Visa

Accommodation | Copenhagen

There are a few hotels within walking distance to the Aalborg University, Copenhagen.

- [Scandic Sydhavnen](#), 700m to campus (around DKK 800 per night); alternatively, [Scandic Sluseholmen](#) is located 1.2km from campus and cost around the same price.
- [Moxy Copenhagen Sydhavnen](#), 550m to campus (around DKK 700 per night)



Safety

Copenhagen is a safe city; however, take general precautions as in any other big city. Keep an eye on your belongings and be aware of pickpocketing.

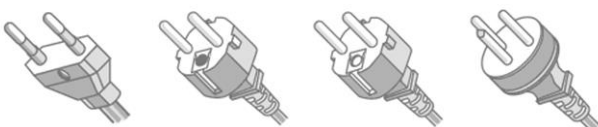
The city is full of cyclists and you do not want to accidentally step onto the bike lanes, so keep clear of these.

Weather

The average temperature in June is 20 degrees Celsius, with an average rainfall of 52mm. The weather in Denmark is rather unpredictable, so it might change between being warm and sunny to a rainfall. Other Relevant Information

The plugs in Denmark are the two-pin continental plug – like in most other European countries. They are type E and K plugs.



Most Danes speak English and you will easily get around in Copenhagen by only speaking English.

Danish (Dansk in Danish) is a Scandinavian language and is part of the North Germanic language group which includes Norwegian, Icelandic, Swedish and Faerose. As such, the written form of Danish is very similar to all these languages. Tourist Attractions in and around Copenhagen

If you want to spend some time in or around Copenhagen, we have some ideas of what to do.

Copenhagen

You can see most of the popular tourist attractions in one day, as they are mainly located in the City Centre (Indre By). Take a walk down *Strøget* (main shopping street) to *Nyhavn* from where you can walk to the royal palace, *Amalienborg Slot*, and *The Little Mermaid* at Langelinie. Take a stroll around the area and see *Kastellet*, which is one of the best-preserved fortresses in Northern Europe.

If you wish to see the city by water, you can go on a canal tour, which departs from Nyhavn. Copenhagen has many towers, thus you can also get a nice view of the city from one of these, for example *Rundetårn*, *Christiansborg Slotstårn* and *Vor Frelzers Kirke*.

When it is sunny, Danes take advantage of the many parks in the city. A popular one is *Kongens Have* where the castle with the crown jewels, *Rosenborg Slot*, is located. Else, you can visit the amusement park, *Tivoli*. If you want to go for a swim, you can visit the *beach at Amager* or *Svanemøllen*, or try one of the *harbor baths*, the one at *Islands Brygge* is popular.

Copenhagen has many interesting [museums](#) you can visit. Additionally, the city is a good place to see Danish architecture; the following link contains some suggestions visitcopenhagen.com.

Places to visit around Copenhagen

If you wish to go on a day trip outside of Copenhagen, then here are a few recommendations.

In *Roskilde*, 30 minutes from Copenhagen by train, you can visit the *Viking Museum* by the harbor, the old *Cathedral* or just take a stroll through the city. Another interesting city is *Helsingør*, 45 minutes from Copenhagen by train, where you can see *Kronborg Castle*.

Do you want to explore the nature? Then a good place is the two chalk cliffs *Møns Klint* and *Stevns Klint*, the latter is the easiest to reach from Copenhagen. You can also go to *Camp Adventure* in the forest by Haslev where you can walk up the 45m tall spiral tower, *Skovtårnet*, and get an impressive view of a large part of Sjælland.
