**CIB Co-Sponsored Conference Call for Abstracts  
SBE 2019 Cardiff, Wales  
Policy of Practice**



On 24 and 25 September 2019 the Cardiff University and Cynnal Cymru will host the Sustainable Built Environment Conference.

The aim of this event is to bring together climate and energy researchers, built environment professionals, policy experts and government officials to focus on the transition of energy and low carbon policies into practice. The conference topics will allow delegates to increase their knowledge and skills related to climate change policies and actions, building design, renovation and retrofit issues and the performance of buildings and materials.

The 2019 SBE Conference in Cardiff will take place in a city centre location over 2 days on the 24th and 25th September 2019.

The conference will include a series of key note speaker presentations, break-out sessions, workshops, a climate change round table debate and limited number of 'on location' visits demonstrating best practice.
